Bob Kurtz said having Safe Built as the operator can help safeguard against times if there are revenue decreases. They are located nationwide which helps spread it out. Bob also said that just because a city signs on with the Sandusky County program, they can opt-out at any time. The County can also opt back in with State should it ever need to in the future.

Mike Lantz with the City of Bellevue said everything is going great with County Building Code Department. Prior to signing on with the County it was taking a long period of time to get information back from Richland County. The entire City of Bellevue is signed on with Sandusky County Building Codes Department at this time. Mike expressed that he would be willing to write a letter of support or take calls from any other village or city not yet signed up.

Assisting Residents with inspections mandated by utility companies Bob Kurtz explained that county residents had been calling the Building Codes Department about getting assistance to get an inspection in order to get their power turned on. The department did for a few residents but not doing them anymore.
